DEALING WITH COMPLAINTS - SCHOOL COMPLAINTS PROCEDURES FOR ALL GOVERNORS

Event Description

New Course

Any person, including members of the general public, may make a complaint about any provision of facilities or services that a school provides. In accordance with Section 29 of the Education Act 2002, all LA maintained schools must therefore have and make available a procedure to deal with all complaints relating to their school and to any community facilities or services that the school provides

This briefing is relevant to all governors of all school settings. The aim is to provide a comprehensive overview of the school's complaints procedure and the statutory duties placed on Governing Boards of Local Authority (LA) maintained schools however, the principles are applicable to all schools. The purpose is to ensure all governors are aware and confident in the knowledge of national and local best practice advice and guidance on school complaints procedures.

The objective of the session will be to embed the duties placed on governors through discussion and information sharing. This in turn will allow delegates to ensure their schools are fully compliant and adhering to relevant legislation and publication requirements. The session will also cover strategies to ensure governors are aware of their monitoring and scrutiny role with regard to complaints.

It will also allow governors the opportunity to share experiences, if appropriate, in a confidential environment and build their confidence and skills in dealing with formal stages of the complaints process.

The session will cover the complete complaints procedure in terms of:

- Timeliness
- Stages
- Recording complaints
- Governing Board review

The briefing will also cover complaints not in scope of the school's complaints procedure and discuss strategies of how to deal with serial and persistent complainants.

Delegates can also expect to gain advice and guidance from invited current governors with the skills and knowledge of dealing with appeal panels and investigations first hand.

OFSTED - THE NEW FRAMEWORK 2019

Event Description

Ofsted's new inspection framework for September 2019 has a greater focus on the wider curriculum and education in its fullest sense – not just test results. Inspections will focus less on internal school assessment data (though the focus on published data remains) and give greater attention to other indicators of achievement, drawing on a wealth of research that Ofsted have published about all areas of the framework.

This session will cover:

2. How schools can use this framework to inform their self-evaluation
3. Implications of what the changes mean for governance
4. Explore the role of governors in preparing and contributing to an Ofsted inspection

GETTING TO GRIPS WITH GOVERNANCE - NEW GOVERNOR INDUCTION

Event Description

This course provides all new/nearly new governors/trustees and clerks with an essential understanding of their role and key responsibilities. In all school settings, boards should have a strong focus on the three core functions:

- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction
- Holding the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils, and the performance management of staff; and
- Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.

These functions are reflected in the criteria Ofsted inspectors use to judge the effectiveness of governance in both maintained schools and academies. They are also discussed further in departmental advice set out in The Governance Handbook.

The session will focus on the key roles of governance and ensure that course members are well prepared to take an active part within the governing board meetings to support and develop in their individual schools and be an active part of their Governing Boards. A question and answer session will also allow new governors to find the answers they need to be an effective governor.

Participants will gain a clear understanding of:

- The legal framework for governing boards
- The key roles of a governing board (including accountability and how to fulfil the role)
- How to operate effectively as a governor (what questions to ask etc.)
- Key educational terminology (highlighting key educational issues)
- How and where to access information to enable governors to flourish in their role

GETTING IT RIGHT AS A PARENT GOVERNOR

Event Description

Currently school governing bodies are required to have elected parent governors. School governing bodies are also expected to act as Boards. Effective Governing Boards have a significant impact on school improvement and all Board members, including parent governors, need a sound understanding of their role and responsibilities.

Parent governors are elected by other parents at the school. Any parent, or carer, of a registered pupil at the school at the time of election is eligible to stand for election as a parent governor. Parent governors may continue to hold office until the end of their term of office even if their child leaves the school.

Schools must make every reasonable effort to fill parent governor vacancies through elections. Consequently it means that this role is a significant and important addition to a Board and a role which can be both rewarding and challenging for those that are appointed.

Event content

This course will provide parent governors the opportunity to consider their role and its responsibilities. We know that being a parent governor is both challenging and rewarding, the course will enable parent governors to share and discuss their concerns and agree ways in which they might deal with some of the issues they may face. It will also be a valuable opportunity to meet and network with parent governors from other schools and exchange experiences.

The session will consist of a presentation on the role of a parent governor and a number of activities that provide participants with opportunities to discuss and then reflect on some of the challenges they may face and some of the worries that they have about undertaking their role successfully.

The course will cover:

- The relationship with parents and how to support and report back
- The relationship with staff and the head teacher
- How to deal with sensitive issues
- Conflicts of interest; confidentiality; and the difficult subject of perceived 'no go' areas including 'are there any areas that are off limits for parent governors?'

This course will help governors to separate their role as a parent and as a parent governor.

This session is ideal for any new parent governors or experienced governors who would like to refresh their knowledge. It will not explore the role of the Governing Body in depth therefore it is advised that all parent governors attend the 'Getting to Grips with Governance' course before booking to attend this session.

GETTING IT RIGHT AS A STAFF GOVERNOR

Event Description

New Event

Event Introduction

Currently all school governing bodies have an elected Staff Governor. School governing bodies are expected to act as Boards and effective Governing Boards have a significant impact on school improvement. Board members, including Staff Governors, therefore require a sound understanding of their role and responsibilities. Staff Governors are elected by the school staff and they cease to hold office when they cease to work at the school.

Teaching and support staff who, at the time of election, are employed by either the governing body or the local authority to work at the school under a contract of employment are eligible to be a Staff Governor.

It is important that Staff Governors understand the nature of the role of a governor – and specifically that their role will not be to represent staff, but to act as an individual, who is representative of the staff workforce. Staff Governors operate as part of the collective Governing Body to provide strategic leadership.

Event content

The role of a Staff Governor can be both challenging and rewarding and presents an excellent opportunity for the individual member of staff to contribute to the decisions that are made by the Governing Body as well as to build strong links between the Governing Body and the staff of the school. Experience of being a School Governor is also very useful for any teachers who aspire to move into school leadership and management, it is a great professional development opportunity.

This event will consist of a presentation plus a number of questions that will be used for group discussions. The questions relate to common problems and issues encountered by Staff Governors. Sharing approaches raised in discussion significantly improves participant's confidence in handling issues in school appropriately.

The session will cover the importance of the Governing Body as a whole and the following key factors in the role of the Staff Governor including; dealing with complaints from parents and staff; handling issues raised by staff; distinguishing between the relationship with the Headteacher as a member of staff and as a Staff Governor; conflict of interest and handling confidential matters; the challenge role as a Staff Governor.

MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID (MHFA 2 DAYS)

Youth Mental Health First Aiders have:

- An in depth understanding of young people's mental health and factors that affect wellbeing

GETTING TO GRIPS WITH GOVERNANCE - NEW GOVERNOR INDUCTION

Event Description

This course provides all new/nearly new governors/trustees and clerks with an essential understanding of their role and key responsibilities. In all school settings, boards should have a strong focus on the three core functions:

- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction
- Holding the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils, and the performance management of staff; and
- Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.

These functions are reflected in the criteria Ofsted inspectors use to judge the effectiveness of governance in both maintained schools and academies. They are also discussed further in departmental advice set out in The Governance Handbook.

The session will focus on the key roles of governance and ensure that course members are well prepared to take an active part within the governing board meetings to support and develop in their individual schools and be an active part of their Governing Boards. A question and answer session will also allow new governors to find the answers they need to be an effective governor.

Participants will gain a clear understanding of:

- The legal framework for governing boards
- The key roles of a governing board (including accountability and how to fulfil the role)
- How to operate effectively as a governor (what questions to ask etc.)
- Key educational terminology (highlighting key educational issues)
- How and where to access information to enable governors to flourish in their role

UNDERSTANDING THE AUTISM SPECTRUM AND SOCIAL COMMUNICATION DIFFICULTIES - WHAT GOVERNORS NEED TO KNOW

Event Description

This new session is designed to promote a greater understanding of how individuals may be affected by autism and how this may impact on their inclusion in schools. There will be opportunities to dispel some myths about autism and we will consider some case studies relating to how school teams can be supported in ensuring they use their best endeavours to include pupils on the autism spectrum. There will also be opportunities to consider how barriers to inclusion may be reasonably challenged in different schools.

The session will be delivered by Dawn Clegg, an Assistant head teacher at Springhallow school for 14 years. Dawn leads a small outreach team, which supports staff in Ealing's mainstream schools to include their pupils with autism and social communication needs. This is done through individual referrals and through training. Her background is in special education and includes supporting individuals from nursery age to adulthood.
